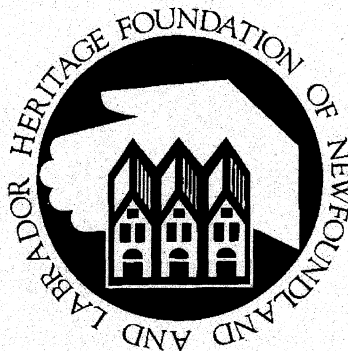

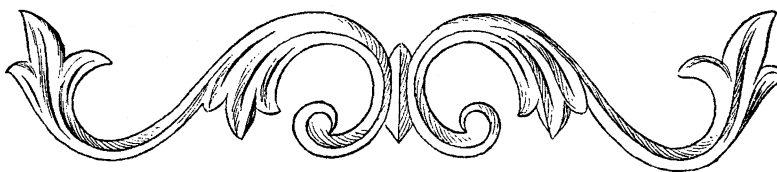

## Introduction

The Twillingate Heritage Inventory was designed to identify potential heritage structures on the Twillingate Islands. The selection of buildings was made on the basis of age, architecture and history. All structures built before 1920, their significant architectural features and information available on their building history were recorded. This initial phase of the inventory will provide a global picture of the building stock and will permit selection of the more significant structures for more detailed architectural recording and more thorough historical research.

The significance of this inventory is that it will enable us to determine what are the most significant surviving examples of Newfoundland's architecture on the Twillingate Islands, whether they be sheds or churches, flakes or houses. It will enable us to see how architecture is part of our social and economic growth; how it is as distinctive as we are - and how it may be used to help us develop in the future. The Heritage Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador has long recognized and been an advocate of using our architectural heritage as an important factor in the development of our tourist industry. To preserve individual structures and groups of those structures is to create a tourism generator of major value. The unique and striking architecture of Newfoundland has served to draw many tourists to the province. It is crucial, if we wish not only to sustain that aspect of our economy but, also, to increase it, that we know what is worthy of preservation and act to ensure its preservation.

Our architectural heritage is not only of value to our economic growth, it also contributes to our social survival. If we recognize the value of what our ancestors built and document the skills they used in building, then we will have begun to shape that sense of identity essential to our making a full contribution to Canadian society.

## Methodology

In order to do a complete inventory in the time allotted, the system developed by the Canadian Inventory of Historic Building (CIHB) was adapted. Two major areas looked at were; history and architecture. Historically, the date of construction, any major alterations, the name of architect and/or builder, of the original owner and subsequent owners (if of historical significance), and any important events held in or associated with the building were recorded. Architecturally, all building elements; roof, windows, doors, siding, foundations, method of construction and decorative trim, were recorded. In recording these features, the inventory will, when completed, allow the architectural patterns of individual communities and particular regions to be determined. It will also allow the evolution of architecture in the different regions of the province to be determined. A decision was made to include all structures constructed before 1920 because, architecturally, that took in the close of the influence of the Queen Anne Style and, historically, the decade of World War I.

Structures recorded were selected by:

1. Visual survey - any structure whose architectural features appeared to meet the age criteria
2. Oral survey - any structure reported to meet the age criteria

## Twillingate

Less bound to one merchant than Fogo, Twillingate had a number. Like Fogo it benefitted from the inshore fishery of Notre Dame Bay and the Labrador fishery in summer, the seal fishery in winter. Its economy was also augmented by trapping in the interior along the Exploits River.

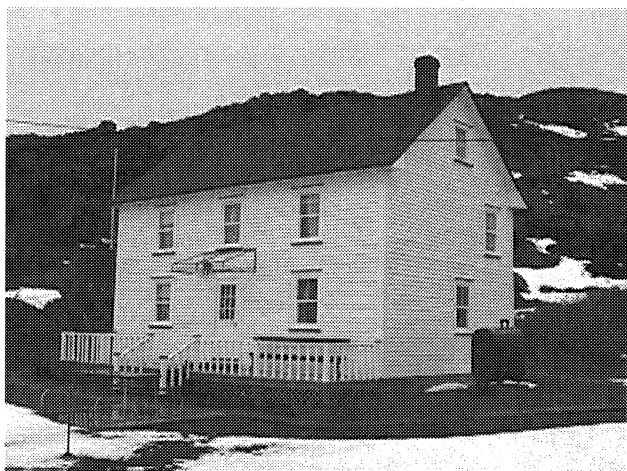
Throughout the Eighteenth Century the population of Twillingate, then the furthest settlement on the English shore, was less stable than that of Fogo. While in 1738 their populations were the same, In 1786, after a bad fishery, Twillingate's population fell to one-third of Fogo's. That bad year broke the migratory fishery and saw the establishment of a local fishery requiring locally-based merchants to supply the fishermen and export their catch.

Again it was principally an operation of English merchants out of Poole in Dorset. The most substantial of these was John Slade who made a great contribution to the community but who, like many of the merchants, eventually returned to England. It was the planters rather than the merchants who stayed and gave a personal continuity to the town. Among the important planters were the Peytons. John Peyton served as Justice of the Peace for Twillingate and is famous for his part in the capture of the Beothuck Desmasduit (Mary March) during which her husband Nonosbausut was murdered. Twillingate was one of the northern islands to which the Beothuck would venture in summer in their search for fish and seabirds. It was also the haunt of earlier aboriginal peoples among them the Dorsets whose remains have been found at Back Harbour.

French doors on right side of facade. Originally there was a full length verandah along the front of the house with overhanging roof with wooden support columns, and some wooden decoration at the top of the columns. Along the side of the house was a conservatory, approx. 25' long and 9' wide, which held plants and flowers. Removed 1910-1920. Originally had 8 fireplaces. Wm. Menchinton, a native of Somersetshire, planter and trader had plantation, mercantile establishment, fishery room and houses at Twillingate. Through these establishments, Menchinton and Harris contributed to the local economy as well as to the development of the fisheries in the province. Edwin Duder and Robert Muir purchased the house on May 29, 1852. During Duder's time the house was used as a residence for members of the Duder family, his agent, etc... After his death, the property was owned by his son, Edwin John Duder. After Duder's business failed during the financially difficult times of the late 1800's, the Commercial Bank of NF took over the affairs. House purchased by William Ashbourne Jan. 7, 1897. Upon Wm's death in 1922, it passed to his son, Thomas. On his death, it passed to his widow, Bernice Ashbourne. Designated a Registered Heritage Structure May 3, 1991.

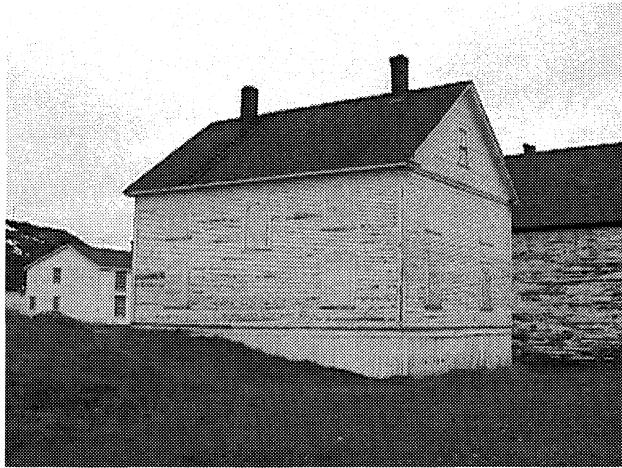

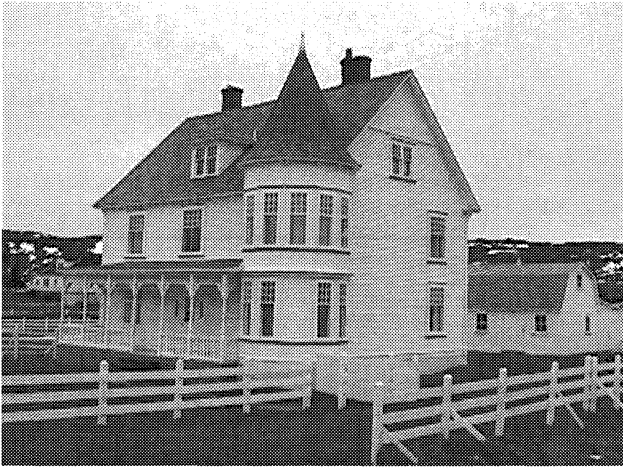

Porch with spindle work and brackets. Tower, decorative shingles on tower and gable end. Wood shingles taken off roof in 1966, back pantry taken off in 1951 and new pantry constructed. Front sitting room once had patio door to front of house. Built on land sold by Edwin Duder to Dr. J. Stafford this house replaces an earlier one which burnt in 1911. Apparently the house was originally built with two storeys the third storey and the turret bay added at a later date. The structure is essentially a large mercantile outport house with Queen Anne modifications in the form of an elaborate porch and turret. The house was purchased by the Ashbournes in 1947. The present owner has an extensive and interesting collection of period antiques and Newfoundland artifacts.

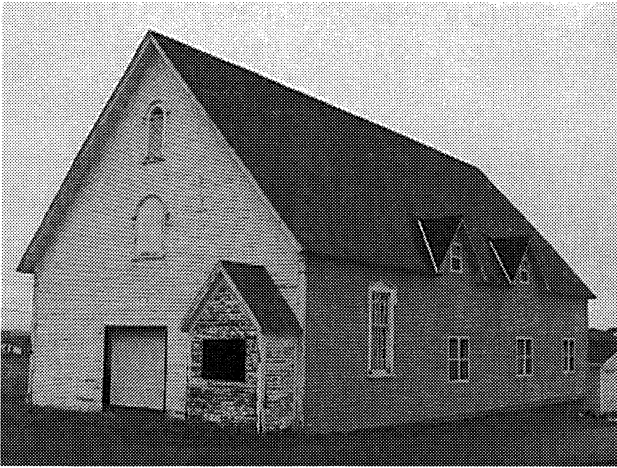

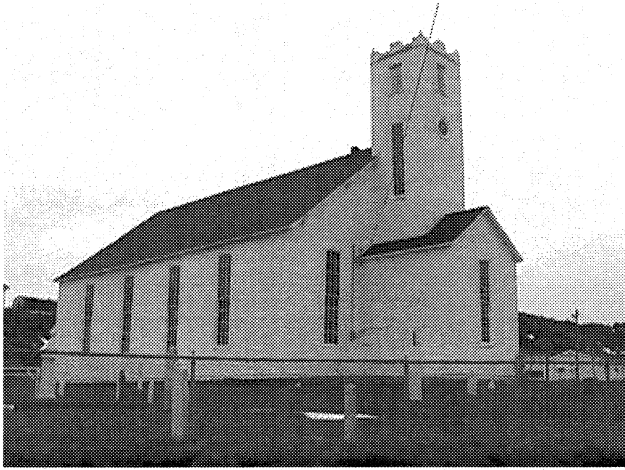

Other Notes of Interest

Crenellated tower. Organ was purchased from Gower Street United Church in St. John's. Last used as a church in 1987. The interior has galleries which go all the way around its four sides. The carved pulpit is of a height to allow the minister to easily address the people in the galleries and those seated in the main body of the church. The church can seat approx. 1000 people in its straight backed, hand carved pews. The use of wide pine boards is evident in the walls, floors and roof. Throughout the building there is uniform fake graining. Rosettes are carved in the wainscotting. Methodism was introduced to Twillingate in 1794. In 1831 secret meetings were held in the homes of believers in Methodism and by 1841 they had advanced in their following to the point where it was necessary to build a church. The original Methodist Church, built in 1841-2, was destroyed by fire February 13, 1868. Belfry added in the 1950's.

Tower with circular window, decorated frieze and dome. Large Masonic eye and insignia in gable. Clapboard at base of structure on bias. Built in 1906 this Masonic hall is in the tradition of all Newfoundland Masonic halls in the elaborate detailing of its exteriors. The offset tower gives it something of the character of a church but this impression is disturbed by the ovoid dome which tops the tower. Beneath the heavily bracketed eaves is set a large panel with finely carved Masonic emblems. The main doorway, the windows and cornerboards are decorated with pilasters. A renaissance touch is added with the differing window treatments on the first and second storeys. The first storey windows are surmounted by pediments, while the second story windows are surmounted by segmental arches containing windows with simple tracery. Above the main door is a pointed segmental arch.

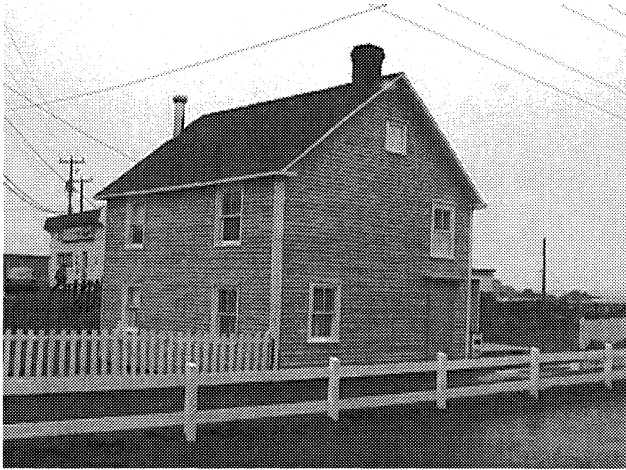

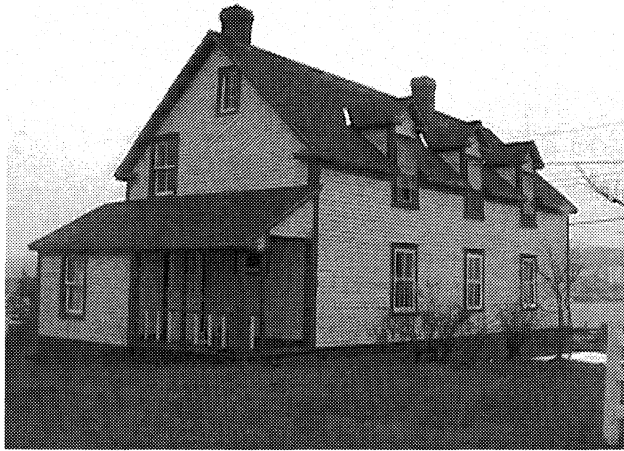

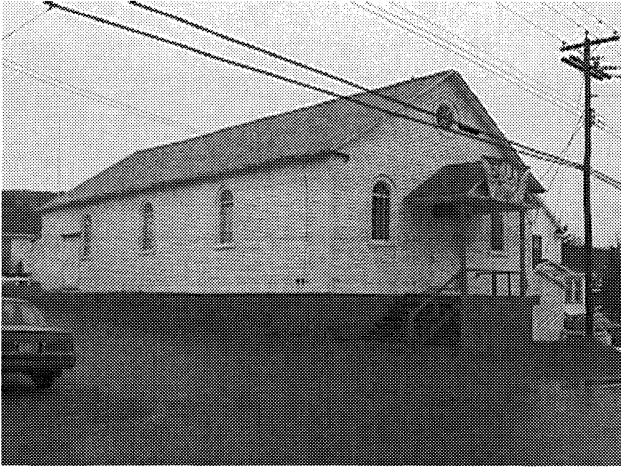

Single detached. 6 pane window in gable end. Designated as a Registered Heritage Structure by the Heritage Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador on May 15th, 1993. Malcolm G. Loveridge was a well-known, respected member of the community and was quite active in that regard. He was a member of the Twillingate Memorial Hospital board of directors for many years as well as participating in other organizations assisting in the well-being and stature of the area. His wife Agnes was also very active in community affairs. When known as the Ford Hotel, a longtime guest was the Inuit woman Anauta, the heroine of an American novel about her life, written by Heluiz Chandler Washbourne in 1940. Exact construction date unknown. Owners: up to 1907, Peter Samways; 1907-1915, Sarah J. Morgan, Carrier M. Patten and Mary B. Patten; 1915-1920, Henry T. Ford, photographer, who ran the Ford Hotel; 1921-1938, Arthur Ashbourne; 1938-?, Malcolm G. Loverage. Original dumbwaiter removed in mid 1940's.

Single detached with linhay on back, door on right side of building, circular window in front gable end. In 1869 the building, formerly use as a storeroom by an English firm of Messrs. Waterman and Co., was purchased by the Sons of Temperance Society as their meeting place. The actual construction date and how long it was used by Waterman is unknow. The first meeting of the Temperance Society was held March 25, 1869, and an interesting motion was adopted "Any brother or sister smoking or chewing tobacco in the hall is to be fined 10 shillings". With the forming of St. Peter's Lodge No. 12 of the SUF in 1875, the building was soon used as a meeting place by the SUF, the Sons of Temperance, and another society, the Crosby Lodge of the LOA. Crosby Lodge LOA sold their share in the builing to St. Peter's Lodge in 1909, presumably to mot to their own building, Alexandria hall across the street. The Sons of Temperance and the SUF stayed together until 1917 when the Temperance Society also sold their share to St. Peter's Lodge for \$150. The building was named Victoria Hall in honour of Queen Victoria, who was reigning monarch when the SUF started their meetings.

Crenellated tower with spire and clock. St Peter's Church is one of the oldest wooden churches still in existence in Newfoundland. While the main portion of the church was erected in 1842, it was not until 2 years later, in 1844, that the tower was completed. The church was consecrated by Bishop Feild in the summer of 1845. In 1862 the church parishioners subscribed to the purchase of the tower bell in grateful appreciation of the bountiful seal harvest of that year. The church replaced an earlier church which had been built in 1827. In 1884 a chancel was added by Titus Manuel and built in memory of Edwin Duder. The church has a strong connection with St. James in Poole, Dorset, the home port of many of the Newfoundland merchants and in particular of John Slade. Slade contributed timbers to the building of St. James Church and acquired from that church the brass candle sconces which he gave to St. Peter's. The galleries in the church take its interior back to an earlier period of church design. It is interesting to note that Bishop Feild consecrated the church for he, as an ardent Gothic Revivalist, was strongly opposed to the use of galleries and had them removed from as many Newfoundland churches as he could.

The building, erected in 1910 by free labour, was for over 50 years the armory or drill hall or meeting place for the Arm Lads Brigade (ALB). In 1908, an old soldier from Jersey in the Channel Islands, and whose name has been long since lost to history, spent a month in Durrell. He had fought in the Boer War (1899-1902) and used his expertise to instruct several of the boys in the area. For three nights a week he gave his assistance to the eager boys who "were anxious for physical fitness and discipline" noted an earlier source of information. Their meeting place was a fish store on Howlett's Island. On the departure of the soldier, other interested leaders came forward and continued the movement. In 1910, the lads purchased materials and gave their services freely to erect an armory. Surplus rifles from the Boer War were purchased from England and a uniform adopted. The uniform was worn until the 1950's. Military drill, based on a publication by the London War Office of 1902, was beneficial when WWI broke out. 32 members of the brigade volunteered and went to St. John's where they were so well prepared their were ready for overseas duty without further training.
